SELF-SUFFICIENCY LADDER

Serve Denton's mission is to support nonprofits that open doors for people to become self-sufficient.

We achieve our mission through nonprofit centers such as The Wheeler House and the Serve Denton Center.

The Wheeler House consists of a transitional housing facility for women and their children managed by Giving Hope, Inc. and an affordable health clinic managed by Health Services of North Texas. The Serve Denton Center houses multiple nonprofit agencies so those in need only have to visit one location to receive help.

This is our Serve Denton Self-Sufficiency Ladder. In order for someone to become self-sufficient, they must successfully address several of the issues exhibited on these rungs.


